5. Actor Submits for Project

- Chooses roles
- Fills out custom fields

6. Caster Sorts Actors

7. Caster Uses Correspondence Tool & Scheduler to Schedule Auditions

- Further research is necessary. This might be better handled purely off-line and via email.

8. Audition Session Happens

- Off-line

9. Videos and Notes Are Added to the System if Available


10. Go to Step Six

- "Yes" group from first round is made Active
- "Nos", "Maybes", "Unsorted" are made Inactive
- Sorting View is set to Active Only
- Unsorted Bucket is Hidden
- Actors are sorted out of Yes into No and Maybe
- On subsequent iterations, actors are sorted down, and/or made Inactive as appropriate

11. Decisions Are Made

- Eventually, only the actual cast is left in the Active Yes group.

How to move an actor from one panel to another:

- click on one of the buttons on their profile
- drag either photo (profile or current panel) in to the desired panel
- with the actor selected (green border in panel), type the keyboard shortcut for the desired panel: "y" for yes, "m" for maybe, "n" for no.

Photo Actions

- click to select
- drag to sort
- drag to change status
- cmd-arrow to sort
- arrow to change selection
- m/y/n to move selected to another panel

Panel Features

- inactive panels show images faded back and in grayscale
- TAB to change active panel
- on switch, top actor becomes selected

Panel Sizing

- width of profile can be adjusted using dragbar
- profile can be hidden by dragging dragbar to the left
- profile can be maximized by dragging dragbar all the way to the right
- yes/no/maybe/unsorted panels can be resized vertically with dragbars
- if panel is open, it cannot be made smaller than one image height
